FRIDAY, OCTOBER 23

Board your motorcoach for an intriguing Autumn adventure with your Plymouth Travel Tour Director. Your modern motorcoach is air-conditioned and restroom equipped. Enjoy movies and fun along the way. Stops will be made for rest breaks.

Welcome to Old Sturbridge Village, where early America comes to life. Come face to face with the past, where everyday life was a series of struggles and triumphs. Immerse yourself in a re-created 19th century rural New England community where costumed interpreters demonstrate life in the 1800's in 40 buildings, gardens and working farms. Buildings include homes, a blacksmith shop, grist mill, bank, law office, copper shop, school and more. October is the time to celebrate the harvest and the foliage. See the season's crop of squashes and pumpkins curing in the yard and learn how early New Englanders "put up" food to sustain themselves through the winter. Stroll through the Village, stop in to the Gift Shop and sample a treat from the Bake Shop.



Later this afternoon, check into the Sturbridge Host Hotel on Cedar Lake. Your hotel features an indoor pool and spa, fitness center, restaurant and lounge. Take a stroll around this lovely lakeside setting or relax before departing for dinner.

Tonight, prepare to laugh, sing, guess and be entertained as the Salem Cross Inn and the Stageloft Repertory Theatre present a Murder Mystery dinner show. Often called a "hidden jewel" the Salem Cross Inn is a family run restaurant that has established a reputation as one of the finest restaurants in New England. The original building was constructed by John White, grandson of Peregrine White, the first male child born on the Mayflower in 1620. The entire facility is one of the finest examples of colonial restoration in the United States, and is listed in the National Register of Historic Places.



Tonight's "Doo-Wop Murders" showcases Danny "Boom-Boom" Di-Vitro, who is appearing in this oldies but goodies 50's broadcast road show. Actors will sit with your group throughout the evening and you will have an opportunity to interrogate suspects, develop theories and submit answers to solve the crime. *Meal: D*

Optional: ladies pull out your poodle skirts and saddle shoes. Guys slick back your hair and wear your leather jackets and white t-shirts. Dress in your 50's fashions and make this a memorable event.

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 24

After a leisurely breakfast at your hotel, depart for the Salem Witch Museum. View a dramatic history lesson of the events of the Salem Witch Trials of 1692 with stage sets of life-size figures, lighting and narration. Follow the history of witches, witchcraft and witch hunts through the ages. Examine perceptions about the stereotypical witch, aspects of witchcraft in the 17th century, modern witchcraft and the phenomenon of witch hunts. Do you believe in witches? Don't answer until you take the tour!

Enjoy an included lunch before departing for home. Rest stops will be made along the way.

Reservations and Payments:

Reservations will be accepted subject to availability at the time of a request. Deposit is due within 5 days of confirming a tour reservation.
\$150 per person deposit due for multi day tours of 2-6 days.
\$350 per person deposit due for all tours 7 days or longer.
Unless specified, final payment for all tours is due 45 days prior to tour departure.
Payment can be made in person or by phone. Checks, Cash, VISA or MasterCard are accepted.

Cancellation Charges:

If you cancel for any reason prior to tour departure, the cancellation fees are as follows:
More than 90 days prior to departure, your deposit is fully refundable
90 days or less prior to departure, your deposit is non-refundable.
Less than 45 days prior to departure, your full payment is non-refundable.

Name Changes / Transferring Reservations:

There is no charge for name changes / reservation transfers on multi day tours if the change is made 45 days or more prior to departure.

Within 45 days of departure on a multi day tour, all rules of the tour operator, airlines and cruise lines will be in effect. In addition, there is a \$50.00 per person administration fee.

Tours Do Include:

Transportation, services, meals, lodging, sightseeing and entrance fees to attractions as stated in the itinerary, and taxes and gratuities for included services unless otherwise indicated.

Tours Do Not Include:

Sightseeing entrance fees or meals unless specifically listed in the itinerary as included, all items and expenses of a personal nature and gratuities to tour directors, coach directors or special guides.

Accommodations:

Accommodations are based on double occupancy. Single rooms are limited. Triple/quad rooms usually have two double beds. Many hotels have additional charges for a rollaway bed.

Baggage Allowance:

Each traveler may bring one large suitcase and one carry-on bag small enough to fit in the overhead rack on board the coach.

Trip Cancellation Protection:

Optional cancellation insurance is strongly recommended. Participants are urged to review their insurance requirements with their personal insurance agent or consider the Access America (AM) policy available from Plymouth Travel. AM provides coverage for cancelled and interrupted trips, medical costs, travel accidents and lost/stolen baggage. Gratuities:

Gratuities are included for the wait staff of included meals. The customary end-of-tour gratuities to the driver and tour director are voluntary and should be given on an individual basis for a job well done. Suggested amounts: \$3 per person per day to each the Driver and the Tour Director.

Fuel Surcharges:

Due to the volatility of fuel costs, our contracts with airline, cruise lines, and motorcoach companies includes their right to increase their charges based on unanticipated increases in fuel prices.

Travelers with Special Needs:
