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TUESDAY, AUGUST 17***Bar Harbor, Maine***

Your Maritime adventure begins with departures from Plymouth, Littleton & Woodsville (other departures may be added). Aboard your luxury motorcoach, enjoy movies and fun with your Plymouth Travel Tour Director. Upon arrival in Bar Harbor, enjoy free time to explore this picturesque coastal town. Nestled on Mount Desert Island and surrounded by Acadia National Park, its special ambiance blended with Downeast character has attracted visitors for over 100 years. *Overnight in Bar Harbor. Meal: D*

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 18***Bar Harbor — Yarmouth, Nova Scotia — Digby, Nova Scotia***

After an included breakfast, board the 8:00 AM *CAT Ferry* for a three-hour sail to Nova Scotia. The *CAT* is the most amazing car ferry in North America, carrying up to 775 passengers and 240 vehicles. Enjoy a show, try your luck in the casino, watch for whales, or simply relax in the sun.

From the seaport of Yarmouth, follow the Evangeline Trail that parallels the Bay of Fundy coastline. The power of nature is evident all along the magnificent Fundy coast with its world-famous tides and every-changing landscape of rocky shores, fertile farmlands, slat marshes and broad sandy beaches. After arriving in Digby, “the scallop capital of the world.” stroll along the Admiral’s Walk and see the Admiral Digby Museum, Heritage Center, Fisherman’s Memorial, shops, restaurants and more. Later, check into the Digby Pines Resort, overlooking the Bay of Fundy and surrounded with breathtaking beauty. Enjoy the views, recreation and renowned cuisine of this grand resort. *Meals: B,D*

**THURSDAY, AUGUST 19*****Digby, Nova Scotia - Lighthouse Route - Liscomb, Nova Scotia***

Travel across Nova Scotia to Lunenburg, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This magical town perched on the edge of the Atlantic evokes old-world charm with architecture and customs that have been handed down for generations. Continue along the Lighthouse Route, so named for the many lighthouses that dot its coastline, through the lovely town of Mahone Bay, a “picture-postcard” Maritime town. View Nova Scotia’s most famous lighthouse in Peggy’s Cove, where you can send a postcard from the only post office in North America located in a lighthouse. Discover the weather-beaten charm of the wooden fishing shacks and colorful boats and time in this enchanting, quintessential Maritimes fishing village.

This afternoon check into the Liscombe Lodge Resort, tucked away on the tranquil shores of the Liscomb River. Considered the hidden jewel of Nova Scotia’s Eastern Shore and often referred to as the “Nature Lovers Resort”, the lodge offers warm hospitality, hearty meals, delightful accommodations and a wide variety of activities. *Meals: B,D*

FRIDAY, AUGUST 20***Liscomb, Nova Scotia - Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island***

This morning continue your scenic drive north to Sherbrooke Village, once a thriving gold-mining town whose renovated buildings recall the boom years of the 1860’s. Discover a place where time has stood still as you visit the woodturner shop, blacksmith and printery. Continue on to Pictou, known as the “Birthplace of New Scotland” because it was here that the first boatload of Scottish Highlanders landed in 1773 aboard the Hector. Explore the attractively restored waterfront, see a replica of the Hector and visit Hector Heritage Quay. After lunch on your own, board a ferry that whisks you across the Northumberland Strait to Prince Edward Island.



Originally called "Abedweit," meaning "island cradled in the waves" and then re-named Prince Edward Island by the early European settlers, it has become a leader throughout Atlantic Canada in agriculture and tourism. Our day ends in the capital city, Charlottetown, staying at the Rodd Charlottetown for the next two nights. Tonight, dinner is on your own or join us for an unforgettable, optional lobster supper at Fisherman’s Wharf. Included with your dinner is unlimited trips to their famous 60-ft. salad bar featuring homemade breads, chowders, steamed PEI mussels, homemade pies, pastries, ice cream and more! *(Optional dinner \$40) Meal: B*

SATURDAY, AUGUST 21

Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island

Picturesque fishing and farming communities, beautiful churches, and secluded beaches are just some of the highlights awaiting you today. Our local tour includes a visit to the Lucy Maude Montgomery Museum (the author of "Anne of Green Gables"). Here, enjoy a horse & buggy ride, homemade cookies and tea. We'll travel through the Cavendish National Park, visit a preserve company and more. A "Down Home Country Lunch" is included. This is truly a great day! Your evening is at leisure with many possibilities. The waterfront, shops and restaurants are just a short walk from your hotel. *Meals: B,L*

Optional Evening, 7:30 PM: Attend "Anne of Green Gables – The Musical" at the Confederation Centre. It is Canada's longest-running (and most popular) musical. Actual dates and rates have not yet been confirmed for 2010.

SUNDAY, AUGUST 22

Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island - Saint John, New Brunswick

Travel across the Confederation Bridge to New Brunswick. Tour Hopewell Rocks, famous formations carved by the Bay of Fundy's dramatic tides that rise more than 50 feet. Continue on to Saint John, Canada's oldest incorporated city dating back to 1785. While touring Saint John, delight in the sights and stories of the historic downtown, the Old Loyalist Burial Grounds, and more. See the Reversing Falls, a natural phenomenon where the massive tides of the Bay of Fundy force the St. John River to reverse direction. Check into the four-star Hilton located on the waterfront of Saint John and enjoy a savory dinner. *Meals: B,D*



MONDAY, AUGUST 23

Saint John, New Brunswick - Campobello - Camden, Maine

A special day awaits as you journey to Campobello Island, the retreat of Franklin D Roosevelt. Begin at the Visitor Center, where panels, displays and a short video interpret the Roosevelt story from the time Franklin Roosevelt and his family first visited Campobello through his battle with polio, his presidency and the establishment of the park. A short walk past beautiful flower gardens will lead you to Franklin and Eleanor's summer home with its simple wicker furniture and knick-knacks. View the gardens and forests, bays and shoals - all the natural beauties that the Roosevelt family knew.



This afternoon, depart for Camden Maine and check into the lovely Country Inn at Camden, featuring "all the charm of yesterday with all the amenities of today." There will be time to freshen up before your included lobster-dinner. *Meals: B,D*

TUESDAY, AUGUST 24

Camden, Maine - Home

This morning say a fond farewell to the Maritimes and depart for home treasuring memories of natural beauty, delightful villages, rich history and warm hospitality. We will stop for rest breaks and an included lunch. *Meal: B,L*

Reservations and Payments:

Reservations will be accepted subject to availability at the time of a request. Deposit is due within 5 days of confirming a tour reservation.
\$150 per person deposit due for multi day tours of 2-6 days.
\$350 per person deposit due for all tours 7 days or longer.
Unless specified, final payment for all tours is due 45 days prior to tour departure.
Payment can be made in person or by phone. Checks, Cash, VISA or MasterCard are accepted.

Cancellation Charges:

If you cancel for any reason prior to tour departure, the cancellation fees are as follows:
More than 90 days prior to departure, your deposit is fully refundable
90 days or less prior to departure, your deposit is non-refundable.
Less than 45 days prior to departure, your full payment is non-refundable.

Name Changes / Transferring Reservations:

There is no charge for name changes / reservation transfers on multi day tours if the change is made 45 days or more prior to departure.

Within 45 days of departure on a multi day tour, all rules of the tour operator, airlines and cruise lines will be in effect. In addition, there is a \$50.00 per person administration fee.

Tours Do Include:

Transportation, services, meals, lodging, sightseeing and entrance fees to attractions as stated in the itinerary, and taxes and gratuities for included services unless otherwise indicated.

Tours Do Not Include:

Sightseeing entrance fees or meals unless specifically listed in the itinerary as included, all items and expenses of a personal nature and gratuities to tour directors, coach directors or special guides.

Accommodations:

Accommodations are based on double occupancy. Single rooms are limited. Triple/Quad rooms usually have two double beds. Many hotels have additional charges for a rollaway bed.

Baggage Allowance:

Each traveler may bring one large suitcase and one carry-on bag small enough to fit in the overhead rack on board the coach.

Trip Cancellation Protection:

Optional cancellation insurance is strongly recommended. Participants are urged to review their insurance requirements with their personal insurance agent or consider the Access America (AM) policy available from Plymouth Travel. AM provides coverage for cancelled and interrupted trips, medical costs, travel accidents and lost/stolen baggage.
